Notes from Fr. Walsh


Thank you all for your being part of the Mass last week. Our census showed 304 people in attendance. We'll count it again this week, and then send the numbers to the Bishop. The Diocese has a data base for all the parishes, and has put our parish census at 618 persons. I think this is a bit high, since a recent review of our membership identified 148 families in our parish, not the 199 families indicated on the diocesan statistical report. "Statistically" and, you know what they say about statistics, our parish count is probably closer to 460 people, which means that our attendance last weekend was about 66% of the parish population. "Statistically" (yeh, we know what they say), this is very good in comparison with national trends, and even our diocesan trends. The diocese is averaging about 50% attendance at weekend Masses. That number is falling about 1% annually. Not good.

Our Matt Talbot kitchen night is October 31—Halloween! That should be fun. We took up a second collection for this effort in August, and raised over \$480. I think we have enough to cover expenses for this month. If we need another second collection for our January meal, I'll let you know. Thanks to everyone who helps with this project.

I've mentioned, in past notes, my interest in electronic giving for the parish. We will work with a company called Faith Direct to provide this product to parishioners. Enrollment can be done on line or through the mail. I'll have more information about this in the coming weeks, but look forward to it. Electronic giving is easy, secure, and self-directed. They even provide little offertory cards to put in the basket each week—if you like the habit (or for the kid's sake, the witness)—of putting something in the basket as it goes by. I look forward to sharing this resource with you all, and promise—I'll be the first to enroll!
