Notes from Fr. Walsh

Holy Day of Obligation: this coming Friday is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mass will be offered on Thursday evening, October 31 at 5:30 pm and on Friday, November 1 at 6:30 am and 6:30 pm.

Devotion to the Poor Souls. Mass will be offered on Saturday morning at 8 am for the poor souls in purgatory. The Church offers a plenary indulgence (one per day) from November 1 through November 8 for those who visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls. We are able to apply this plenary indulgence to a poor soul. Part of this spiritual work includes prayers for the Holy Father (usually an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be), confession and Holy Communion on or within 7 days within the period of the indulgence, and freedom from the attachment to sin.

Another pious and longstanding devotion for the poor souls is having Masses offered for them. We should make it the practice during the month of November to consider all the people in our life who have blessed us and our now deceased, and have a Mass offered for them. Perhaps it was a high school classmate or teacher, a priest of the past, a boss, parents, children and siblings. One of my people this month will be Tom Leehy, my high school coach who died from cancer back in 1990. I remember when he was diagnosed, and a visit I made to him, trying to express my sympathy. He told me: "You think you'll live forever. I'm blessed to know that the end is near so I can prepare for it." He always had the right thing to say, and was a true mentor for me. I offered and preached his funeral Mass.

Offering a Mass for a deceased love one is one of the best ways of keeping our love flowing to that individual. It's a different type of communication; it's spiritual not verbal. But they now live in the spiritual realm. They hear us.

Masses offered for the poor souls include a stipend for the priest. This is done so that the request includes some type of gift from the person who requests the Mass. The usual stipend is \$10. May the souls of all the faithfully departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
