### Notes from Fr. Walsh

Thank you for all the planning and preparation going on behind the scenes to prepare our parish for the celebration of Christmas. Several groups are working, preparing, organizing. I think our Lord will be pleased with our birthday celebration of love. Keep up the good work! NOTE: the CCD children will be using some of the CCD classroom time in the next few weeks to prepare for the Christmas program on December15.

I am at North American Martyrs this weekend, offering a stewardship homily. Fr. Connor has asked me to focus particularly on the tithing element of stewardship. My homily is entitled, Show me the Money! Okay, it isn't but that's pretty funny!


Let me share a few ideas with you that are part of my homily.

1. Think tithe not dollars. Remember the widow in the gospel who gave a few small coins which the Lord said was "everything she had." It was the greatest gift of all. It isn't the amount that we give that counts. It's the gift we give in proportion to what we have. The Bible says: tithe, which is a gift of 10%.

2. Start small. Most of us, if we have no experience in living the tithe, cannot give 10% today. Most of us don't have the flexibility to take 10% of the family income and start giving it away. But we can do something. So, start small. Can you give 2% of your income? How about 1%--or even half of a percent. Suppose you make \$60,000 a year. 10% would be \$6,000. 5% would be \$3,000. 1% would be \$600. ½ a percent would be \$300. Can you give \$300? Use the great Matthew Kelly line: I can do that. We can do that. And that's where we begin.

3. Build annually. Add a half or a whole percent each year. You'll be surprised how easy this is, and how fruitfully the Lord will respond to your goodness. Which brings me to my last point.

4. Find security. I have never met anyone who went broke because of their charity. You cannot outdo the goodness of God. So, don't worry about hurting yourself financially if you are chartable. In fact, if you want financial stability and security, live charity. God bless you!
