Notes from Fr. Walsh

Epiphany Memories. My Dad resisted the secular culture around us, whenever the opportunity presented itself, and Christmas was one of those times. He disliked the commercialization of Christmas, and saw in the gifts of the Magi the Christian practice of giving Christmas gifts. He wanted us to celebrate Epiphany (January 6) as our gift exchange day, not December 25. The problem? Twelve children (eleven living) who had dreamed about jolly old St. Nicholas, and Rudolph the red-nosed reindeer. We won, but he tried, and instead of abolishing Christmas gift giving, we celebrated Epiphany as well. He and Mom could hit some after Christmas sales, and get each of us a few things, and especially even out any oversights that Santa made when visiting us the night before Christmas. We might be sporting a new pair of pants at school in mid-January, and be asked, "Where did you get that?" We learned to respond, "The Epiphany Camel." We kind of felt sorry for others who didn't know the joy of this generous beast of burden.

One Epiphany, Dad was displeased with our behavior. There must have been about 8 kids or so at the time, and it was the school break, and you know what happens when kids are too long indoors with nothing to do. Dad came home from work, with two large sacks of unwrapped gifts. He displayed them to us, and told us that this was what he had planned for us, but because of our bad behavior, we weren't going to receive them. He packed them back in the sack and took them down the street to a poor family. Let's see, that was probably about 1963 or 1964. I can still remember that day. It became part of the annual reminder of good behavior: the Camel was watching!

Epiphany lived on, past our childhood. It became the practice of my brothers and sisters, once they were married and raising their children, to have Christmas at home like we did when we were young. That was a great gift to their kids, but it meant that Christmas was kind of lonely for Mom and Dad and the two unmarried kids in the family, my sister Lil and me. Epiphany came to the rescue. Since it is always the first Sunday after the New Year, and much of the Christmas rush is over, Epiphany became the day when the family would gather with Mom and Dad and celebrate Christmas together. Epiphany gift giving became Mom and Dad's special day to give gifts to their grandchildren (with the help of elves Lil and Joe!). What a delightful celebration. God bless Dad and Mom for helping us understand Epiphany and celebrate it together as a family. Dad won!
