The above is my liturgical schedule for the next two weeks. My plan is to return to the parish on Monday, June 22, but I have a two day workshop for new priests and new pastors at Waverly Retreat house on Wednesday and Thursday, June 24 and 25.

After this period of two weeks, I anticipate things getting back to normal! I do have another family wedding in Omaha on Friday, July 24, which means there will not be a morning Mass in the parish on that day. I'll be staying overnight on Thursday, in Omaha.

Lincoln Public Schools has developed a protocol for opening in the fall, which will likely influence many of the school districts in our area. Further, it is likely to impact our CCD program for the fall. I would like to propose that we begin planning for opening CCD as we did last year, in August, and run the classes in a similar manner as in the past. As this date approaches and I hear more, we'll modify our plan with appropriate safety rules. The big thing now is that we plan to resume CCD classes when the 2020-2021 school year begins.
