#### Notes from Father Walsh...

**Bishop's Appeal for Vocations.** Thank you to all who have participated in the Bishop's Appeal for Vocations. As of October 1, 2020, 17 donors have given \$3,129 to the appeal with our parish goal of \$5,190. I am so proud of this parish and its support, not only for this cause but many others: pro-life, special needs of parishioners, the mission appeal, priest's retirement (our Christmas collection), etc. We've also kept pace with the daily needs of the parish. Thank you all. Give yourself a big pat on the back!

**The Coming Election.** Priests are not to endorse political candidates or parties, but we are asked to vigorously encourage our parishioners to take an active role in politics, and especially to perform the important civic duty of voting. Plan now to make sure you can participate. It will come early next month (November 3). If you need to vote by mail, see this web address to complete the process: <u>https://sos.nebraska.gov/elections/early-voting-0</u>. The last day to request a ballot to be mailed to you is October 23, 2020.

**Prayer for our nation**. One thing I can do is express a deep concern for the safety and well-being of our country and that we all need to be engaged in the political life of our community. Our parish population is around 450 (I need to purchase a new excel program to open the latest statistical report from the Diocese—which I'm working on, in order to give you exact numbers). I will provide a report on our attendance and percentage of participation in a mid-month bulletin.
