Honoring Law Enforcement at St. James: The Knights of Columbus have come up with a great idea to support and recognize members of the Law Enforcement in our community who are presently serving us. These include Jason and Jessica Drager, Rob Brenner, Mike Schmidt, Mike Peschong, Ron Boden and TJ Carmichael. We will host a Eucharistic Holy Hour on October 29, at 7pm, offered for our Law Enforcement. The Knights are also giving each of our honorees a small gift. The parish is invited to join in the Holy Hour, to pray for the safety of our Law Enforcement. Hope to see a full house. Thank you Knights of Columbus.

Mass Attendance. I took a census last weekend, and recorded 185 people in attendance at our three weekend Masses. Our parish population is 570 persons. Earlier this week, I asked Archbishop Lucas about his thoughts on re-instating the Sunday obligation and he said that the Bishops of Nebraska are not intending to restore it anytime soon. COVID continues to be public health issue.

In the meantime, I implore everyone to do something to keep close to the Eucharist. If you decide to stay away for health concerns (to yourself or others), attend Mass on another day of the week, make a holy hour, bring your family to the church and offer the rosary together out loud. Our Blessed Lord gets the COVID problem. He misses us too. We need to find another path to the sea—of his mercy. Be creative! The Sunday Mass obligation is (or was) the principal vehicle we used to *Keep Holy the Lord's Day*. We have to find another way to fulfill this commandment.

Parish Council Meeting. I have a call out to our parish council members to meet on October 26 at 7pm. The agenda will include our first quarter financial performance, the facilities and property issues we have been dealing with, and a discussion about sustaining our membership during these times. For example, what should we do for Christmas? Can you imagine Christmas without Mass? I plan to offer it; will people be able to come? What does the parish need to do to make the Mass accessible?

Other Information and Thanks. This past Wednesday, we had a CCD teachers' meeting. God bless our teachers, Shirley Yates (our coordinator) and all the parents and kids.
