Notes from Father Walsh...

Sorry about last week...I was absorbed at the end of last week with the return of Bishop Conley and forgot about my weekly column in the bulletin. Sorry about the re-run last week. The following is real news!

Thanksgiving Day Mass. I plan to offer Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 8am. It's a reasonable hour and most of us can either return home in time for our preparations or get on the road to our holiday destination. Stay safe. Be careful. And if you're stuck at home by yourself, there are plenty of football games to watch. Dust off a Christmas movie or two. Light a candle next to your favorite statue of Mary and spend some quiet time in prayer. Don't forget: stock the freezer with your favorite ice cream! This day needs to be one of joy and thanksgiving, even if we have to celebrate it away from family.

Special remembrance. During a staff meeting at the chancery this past week, Dr. Hecker, our Chief Administrative Officer for the Catholic schools of the Diocese, reported on the heroic and self-sacrificing efforts our school personnel are making to keep the kids safe and the education going in our schools. It reminds me that this is happening in every school and I want to give a shout out and thank you to all our school personnel who are doing a great job for our kids. The extra classes you monitor, the free periods you give up, all the prep work and clean-up work to keep surfaces disinfected, the careful attention you must give to every kid and their needs and progress: thank you for your efforts! God reward your goodness. Everyone is grateful for your love.

Furnace replacement. The furnace that went down in our buildings is the one located in the choir loft which services the area off the front doors of the church. The cost to replace the furnace and the air conditioner is \$7,100. I received clearance from the Diocesan Building Commission to move forward on the replacement and have signed the contract with Action Plumbing, Heating and A/C, Inc. Installation is planned for November 30.

Bishop's Appeal for Vocation. Here is an update on the Bishop's Appeal for Vocations from our parish. We had 46 families support the appeal, giving an average of \$177.50 per family. The total amount given was \$8,164. Our parish goal was \$5,190, so we surpassed it by \$3,243. Congratulations! Thank you very much. The diocesan goal for the appeal was set at \$799,940. To date, the diocese has received \$772,084 in gifts and pledges from 3,892 families with an average gift of \$198.38. Our diocesan family loves this appeal!

Planning a December Retreat. Because of COVID and other constraints in my life this past several months, I have not taken my annual retreat, which is required of every priest, every year. I will make my retreat at the end of December, departing the parish following Sunday Mass on December 27 and returning to the parish on December 31 in time to offer the Vigil Mass of Mary, Mother of God on December 31 at 5:30pm.
