### Notes from Father Walsh...

**Happy Advent!** I wish everyone a blessed Advent as we prepare ourselves to celebrate Christmas and the gift of the Father to us on this holy night. We need something to lift our spirits and our hopes. Focusing on Christmas, and God's love for us in His Son will restore our hearts. I hope this is a great season of grace for everyone. Try, to the best of your ability, to include a Christmas confession in your spiritual plans for the celebration. I will make extra times available for you during the week before Christmas.

Planning for Christmas Mass, 2020. I don't know what restrictions or recommendations will be made to us from the Governor's office and the chancery relating to our celebration of Christmas. I want to make Mass available to as many as possible, and so propose the following: Two Christmas Eve Masses, either 3pm, 5pm or 8 or 9pm (option for either hour, not both). Midnight Mass. Christmas day Mass at 9am. There will be no December 24 morning Mass. What I'm most interested in is what parents with small kids want. 5pm seems to be just the right time. Would an additional Mass before that or after that help? And if so, which one? I invite any of you to let me know your preference, and we will lock down our schedule in a few weeks.
