### Notes from Father Walsh...

**Happy New Year!** I'm on a kick for the "2021, Best Year Ever." In some ways, I know I won't be wrong because the love of God continues to be poured out in our hearts, calling us to greatness, helping us get there, confirming us in faith and love. Even if we take only a few steps closer to Him this year, it will be the best year ever since this is our destiny, this is our duty, this is our life. May this year be the happiest ever for you all.

**Epiphany.** I think I've shared with you that Epiphany was an important celebration in our home when I was living with the Walsh gang. One year, we celebrated the feast with a play that Dad wrote, using the Gospel of St. Matthew as his story line. It was fun. It happened about 1964 or maybe 1965. I remember we had a squeaky front door, which was a prop. We used it to enter the house of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Everyone heard the squeak. We all knew what it meant. Someone had entered the front door of the house. It was the three kings! My sister Lil, who is now 61, had the most innocent line in the whole play. She was one of the kings, and it was her job to announce, in her five-year-old voice, "Here we are in Bethlehem." Each year, I try to remember to call Lil and give her that line over the phone. It's very special.

St. Matthew provided very little detail about the kings and their visit to the Holy Family, other than to say that upon entry into the home, they prostrated themselves and offered gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Using prophetic texts from the Old Testament, the Catholic people have filled in the picture of this event with pious ideas about the ages and races of the kings. Often, you will see them represented as three different races: African, Asian and European. They might be old, young and middle aged. They represent the East, the Gentiles, the world coming to adore the Child King. One fact of significant importance is that modern astronomy has substantiated that the "Star of Bethlehem" was a real astronomical event. It occurred in 7 or 6 BC. Jupiter rose in conjunction with Saturn in the constellation of Pisces and shone brightly in the evening sky for several days. Jupiter represented the god Marduk, the highest deity of the people of Babylon. Saturn represented the people of Israel. The convergence of the two planets was interpreted by the Magi as a significant event: a king was born among the Jews who would be a savior. It was no accident that wise men traveled from the East to Bethlehem. As St. Matthew explained, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

That is what we do today as well. We worship the King, the Savior of the world. Happy Epiphany!
