NOTES FROM FATHER WALSH...

Divine Mercy Sunday. The Church, especially since 2000 and the canonization of St. Faustina, has celebrated the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. We are asked to attend Mass, pray for the Holy Father, contemplate the mystery of Divine Mercy, and show reverence for the Divine Mercy image. I have traditionally held a Eucharistic Holy Hour at 2:30pm on this day, and will do so again on Divine Mercy Sunday (April 11). I will expose the Blessed Sacrament, and go to the confessional. One of our members will offer the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00. We will have benediction at 3:25. Please come and spend an hour with the Lord and share in Divine Mercy.

First Communion: Eleven members of our community celebrated their First Communion on Saturday, April 10. I am hopeful that the parents will post pictures of the beautiful day on our parish Face Book. The St. Joseph Project. I've announced and invited ideas about a St. Joseph Project for the parish in the Year of St. Joseph. The project that caught the most attention was the idea of doing something in our parish cemetery to honor and include St. Joseph, who is the patron of a happy death. The plan is moving forward! A statue has been purchased. We will place a slab of concrete on the East end of the cemetery, in direct line with the Marian statue. We will have two benches flanking the statue, which will be on a 22 inch stand. If anyone would like to participate in purchasing the remaining items, we have need of one bench (\$700) and the stand (\$430) that still need funding. We are also planning to pull out the cedar bushes that flank the Marian statue and landscape this area. Anyone interested in doing the landscaping? In the winter, we will do something to shore up the erosion in the ditches on the West and North end of the property. Maintenance for the summer will likely run about \$2,500.

My plan is to include this work and the ongoing support of the cemetery in this year's Charity and Stewardship Appeal. We will set aside about \$15,000 for Catholic School education (our annual assessment), and earmarked \$10,000 for the cemetery (the remainder raised will go into our building fund). Presently, we have somewhere north of \$30,000 in our cemetery fund, which we will use if we need. It would be ideal to have an annual campaign to cover our operating costs for the year. It's a beautiful little cemetery, well cared for, a real public sign of our love for our family in heaven.
