NOTES FROM FATHER WALSH...

Just a few thoughts as I conclude my pastorate at St. James, and say good-bye to you this weekend:

Housekeeping. We did a deep clean of the rectory, with shampooing carpets, washing walls and windows, dusting, polishing, and cleansing about every surface and appliance we have. I'm glad to hand off the rectory to Fr. Dietrich in good shape, and I know it will make a great home for him. It was one of the hidden luxuries of my time here. This was the first time in 33 years as a priest that I lived alone. I grew to love it! Thank you.

Charity and Stewardship Appeal. Here is my final report on this year's Charity and Stewardship Appeal. To date, our parish donated \$30,548 in cash and pledges to this appeal. This was 1373.78% over the goal we were given. In terms of goal verse gift, we outpaced every parish in the diocese, the closest to us registering about 700% over goal. Again, the plan is to put \$10,000 in the cemetery fund, use \$15,000 to pay our school assessments and put the remainder in our savings account for future needs. I am proud of you all.

The Cemetery Project. I received notice that the statue and the stand for our St. Joseph shrine at the cemetery will not arrive until sometime in July. Let me know when you have the blessing, because I would like to come and share this moment with you. This was one of the coolest projects I have been associated with in some time. We know our Blessed Mother's statue belongs in every cemetery. Inviting St. Joseph to join Mary and look out for us is a wonderful, pious, tender thought. I'm so glad we did this.

Totus Tuus. I met with Renae Mitchell last weekend, and we talked about the upcoming Totus Tuus program, scheduled for July 25 through July 29. At present we have 26 children scheduled to attend the program. Imagine if we had our whole CCD program in attendance! The power of this program for the young people is the Totus Tuus "faculty". These are committed college and seminarian students, people who have chosen Christ in their lives and want to share their faith. They are also fun people, who love this work and the opportunity to care for the children of our diocese. Please, give this gift to your children. They will never forget the people and experiences of this spiritual, personal, and fun week.

Finally, thank you for our time together, your goodness to me, your openness to the Lord, your kids, and the many talents and gifts you gave to the parish during my two years with you. Our time together was a gift. We're too close to it at present to see the plan and wisdom of God in why this was done and how He was caring for us. He will tell us, in our quiet prayer with Him, and we will see the glory of the Lord. Always in my heart! Fr. Walsh
