Notes from the Pastor:

This coming Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, and is a Holy Day of Obligation. This will be the first observed Holy Day of Obligation since the beginning of the pandemic over a year ago. Please remember that the obligation to attend Mass is the same as for Sunday. Since it will still be a work/school for most people in the parish, the Masses have been scheduled to provide different opportune times for people to attend. Masses will be on Tuesday, December 7th at 5:00 pm, and on the Holy Day itself, December 8th, at 7:00 am and 6:30 pm.

Christmas is coming up quickly, and special plans for our Christmas liturgies are being put in place. Christmas can be a difficult challenge in the parish as far as scheduling: many regulars are gone, many visitors are here, people like to be in the pews with their families, and yet everybody wants a special liturgical experience, which can only happen if there are enough volunteers to bring about truly dignified, beautiful liturgies. To that end, there is a sign-up sheet in the back of church to fulfill all the various duties we will be looking for on Christmas. These include not only the needed acolytes, readers, and servers, but also youngsters to perform special roles in the Mass, and people to man the lights.
