St. James Parish Council and Finance Council Joint Meeting - December 1, 2021 St. James Parish Council met on December 1, 2021 in the parish hall. Those in attendance were Father Dietrich, Pat Milke, Karl Gramman, Melissa Wallman, Denise Clements and Rosie VerMaas.

The meeting was opened with prayer. Minutes of the September meeting were read and approved.

Financial reports were presented by Denise and Melissa. The financial report was approved by the committee.

Concern on the shortage of classroom space was discussed with several ideas presented. The committee will invite Brad Wilken to the next meeting to discuss options to present to the congregation for future plans of how we can address the issue. Future goal is for an addition to the parish hall to include more classroom space, however there were temporary ideas that could be used for a short term solution.

Vici Osterhaus is stepping down from her position and Deanne Stieb will fill that position. Father Dietrich has some suggestions to incorporate in Deanne's role.

Father Dietrich will contact Father Walsh to set a date for the blessing of the St. Joseph statue. March 16th is a tentative date set but will confirm with Father Walsh if that date works with his schedule.

Father Dietrich has contacted a company that will install a keyless touch pad on the outside door on the south side of church. This could be installed possibly by Christmas and will parishioners to enter the church for prayer if the main doors are already locked for the night. A code will be given to those who need it for entry.

Pat Milke presented updates on Building and Grounds. A cleanup date on October 9th was held. A few parishioners showed up to help remove trees and work on the parish grounds. Pat has met with contractors to move forward on the handicap accessibility to church. He has gotten bids for the installation of handrails, culvert and dirt. Pat has also received a bid on the repairing of the steeple and siding from ABC Seamless. Their quote was \$9,000.00 to do the repair work, which was much cheaper than other companies he contacted. This quote was given a couple of months ago – Pat will check to see if the price remains current for the repair project. Pat has replaced several of the ballasts in the lights in the hall. He will contact Doug Amen to check on the outside lights as they do not always work properly.

Father Dietrich suggested the purchase of a Votive Candle stand. Several options are available to order. Father will address this as a possible item parishioners might want to make a donation towards or see if PCCW and the Knights would like to share the cost. Rosie VerMaas mentioned the parish hall could use extra white chairs that match the banquet tables. She will check with some stores for prices. The stoves in the kitchen are in need of replacement. Prices will be checked out at area appliance stores and discussed at the next meeting.
