ST JAMES PARISH COUNCIL AND FINANCE COUNCIL JOINT MEETING MINUTES

St James Parish Council and Finance Council held a joint meeting June 15, 2022. Those in attendance were Father Douglas Dietrich, Ray Vrbka, Pat Milke, Rosie VerMaas, Denise Clements, Melissa Wallman, and Grace Benes.

The meeting was opened with prayer.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

- Father Dietrich reported that the votive light stands were installed. We all agreed they are a beautiful addition to our church.
- The Eucharistic Procession will follow the June 19th 8 A.M. Mass. Father asked that three altars be set up. One outside in front of the church, one by the high school outdoor classroom and one in the vestibule. Father has candles ready and asked that the tables be covered with tablecloths.
- Father Dietrich also reported that the diocese has concerns about church security with protests against the Roe vs Wade decision pending in the US Supreme Court. One of the suggestions is to have only one unlocked entrance to the church for services and to keep the church always locked when not in use.
- Father Dietrich will talk to Father Lux regarding the greeters at Mass. There has not been too much enthusiasm from the young girls of the parish to participate.
- Denise Clements gave the financial report for May 2022. As of May 31, the checking account is at \$32077.56. We have grown our savings account to \$230503.37. St. James's Net Income is currently \$57972.09. No unordinary expenses were discussed in May.
- Pat Milke reported that ABC Seamless repaired the steeple. There is an overpayment of \$3,000.00 due back to the parish. ABC damaged some of the concrete with their heavy equipment and said they will repair it. Pat is still awaiting bids on the handicap parking.
- Pat contacted several people to be on the building and grounds committee. Grace Kissling, Jeremy Jelinek and Cody Larkins have accepted. Pat is waiting for a response from others.
- Smoke detectors for the hall were discussed but no decision made.
- Rosie VerMaas volunteered to write a grant request to Norris Public Power for money to purchase a defibrillator for the parish. Norris offers grants up to \$1,500.00.
- Ray Vrbka will purchase a weed eater for the parish so that the lawn mowing volunteers do not have to provide their own equipment.
- Rosie provided a PCCW update. The parish dinner will be Sunday, June 19th after the 10:30 Mass. Father Dietrich is making spaghetti sauce and the members of the parish are asked to bring salads and desserts.
- Totus Tuus will be held July 23 thru 29th. A host family is needed for the two young men on the team.
- The Knights will serve coffee and rolls on Sunday, June 26th to welcome Father Lux.
- Father Lux will arrive at St James Monday, June 20th. Father Dietrich asked if we could do a quick check of the rectory and have someone there to greet Father Lux when he arrives. Rosie VerMaas and Grace Benes volunteered. Rosie reported that the Oelke family had a couch and chair to donate for the rectory living room.
- The council members thanked Father Dietrich for his service and shepherding of St James this past year.
