FROM THE BISHOP:

To the Clergy, Religious, and Lay Faithful of the Diocese of Lincoln,

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Friday, June 24, 2022 the Supreme Court decision in *Dobbs vs. Jackson* overturned *Roe vs. Wade*. I never thought that I would see this day in my lifetime, but I always believed that this day would come, when *Roe vs. Wade* would no longer be the law of the land. Praised be Jesus Christ!

That this decision was released on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is no coincidence. Our Lord has given us a great gift from the love of His most Sacred Heart. However, we now must reach out to women and families who find themselves in difficult situations and love them with the same love as found in the heart of Christ. We need to accompany them with our love and care, welcome them, walk with them, and show them that life is good, and they are not alone.

["Walking with Moms in Need"](#) was launched on March 25, as a response to a post-*Roe* world. Pregnant and parenting moms in need are in our parishes, at our places of work, and in our neighborhoods. As Pope Francis reminds us, our parishes need to be "islands of mercy in the midst of a sea of indifference." This new initiative, "Walking with Moms in Need" is designed to bring resources through the parish to women who might otherwise not have the necessary resources needed to choose life.

This program is just starting, and we need everyone to play their part. I ask all of you to learn about "Walking with Moms in Need" at your parish, and prayerfully consider how you can help. Our faith places a responsibility on each of us to assist women in difficult situations and build a culture of life and a civilization of love. This is what our faith teaches us: to love our neighbor as ourselves, to reach out to those who are in need, and to accompany those who are in difficulty and crisis.
