<u>THE ST. JAMES CHURCH BUILDING IS TWENTY YEARS OLD.</u> Maintenance on the tower was done shortly before I came. Ongoing maintenance is important to maximize the beauty, life usability, and safety of our property. Thank you to those who have seen the needs and to have them addressed. Of course, there are costs to maintenance. Thank you to all who have given in support of our parish so that we can pay for these repairs. Consider an extra donation to our parish at the end of the year so that we can continue doing the work of the Lord. A couple of recent maintenance projects are summarized:

ELECTRICAL completed by *Ambition Electric* with 34 hours of labor: replacement of all exit signs & emergency lights (18), outdoor lights on poles near entry ways retrofitted to LED (3), awning lights to LED (5), counter light in sacristy to LED, LED replacement in 2 sacristy fixtures, install new outlets in choir loft to eliminate trip hazard, replacement of burnt out fluorescent bulbs in all parish hall rooms to LED (49), track flood light behind tabernacle, replacement of photo electric eye, & replacement of burnt out fluorescent bulbs in church entry. Church labor discount -\$510. Total \$5,625.10.

SIDING ON PARISH HALL completed by Egger Exteriors: removal & replacement of 60 squares of Hardie board siding on East side of parish hall, replacement of 60 sq ft of plywood- rotted wood substructure, ash board installed at bottom, removed & replaced 9 pcs of failed siding on North & West sides, painted old siding repairs to match, house wrap, & window tape. Materials \$2,080.92. Labor \$5,174.36. Total \$7,255.28.

FURNACE & AIR CONDITIONER UNIT IN THE PARISH HALL replacement by Action Plumbing: Champion TM8E100, 80% AFUE gas furnace, New *Champion* TC3B060 5 ton, 13 SEER air conditioner, new return air filter box base, wire, pad, thermostat, materials & labor. <u>Total **\$9,500**</u>.
