He also informed the Knights that there will be a fourth degree exemplification held on May 7<sup>th</sup> at ST. Patrick social hall in Lincoln.

Grand Knight Boden asked the knights to consider forming a church security committee to protect parishioners during Mass.

TREASURER REPORT- Treasurer Ed Zach reported that the treasury has enough money to handle five \$250 scholarships this year. Joe Vinton moved to award scholarships to all five seniors who applied this year. Chris Hytrek seconded the motion and it passed on voice vote. Congratulations to Briana Clements, Cole Ebbers, Nathan Eisenbarth, Sadie Larkins and Lauren Zach, this year's recipients.

The knights will provide rolls and coffee after both Sunday Masses on Mother's Day May 14<sup>th</sup>. Chris Hytrek will pick up the rolls.

The knights will also split the costs of gift cards purchased for CCD teachers with the PCCW. Knights will be asked to help pass out the cards on teacher appreciation Sunday on May 7<sup>th</sup>.

New Business- Jeremy Jelinek reported that he has created a sign up Genie for people to sign up for mowing the church and rectory. The church has two mowers available to use. He also presented a bid for three more irrigation runs on the church grounds of \$3404.50 from Jindra irrigation of Crete. Neil Dominy moved the knights pay up to \$1,800 or half the cost split with the parish council. Jeremy Jelinek seconded the motion and it carried.

The Knights agreed to help again this year as a dropoff site for unsold garage sale items during the Cortland garage sales on June 3<sup>rd</sup>. We will limit the items to only clothes and furniture and refuse anything with an electrical cord attached. Items collected will be delivered to the city mission or Catholic Social Services.

**DISTRICT DEPUTY REPORT-** D.D. Gandara reported on a new pro-life initiative called "Pass the Hat" that will raise funds for woman's health centers across Nebraska. The goal is to raise \$50,000 by May 1<sup>st</sup> which would then be matched by Supreme for a total donation of \$100,000. Chris Hytrek moved that our council donate \$250 to the campaign, Ron Eisenbarth seconded the motion and it carried. To date the Nebraska Knights of Columbus has placed 17, 4-D ultrasound machines in women's care centers across Nebraska.

There being no further business the knights were asked to remember the following individuals in their prayers for the good of the order, Oren and Jen Heusinkvelt, Don Mitchell, Ron Boden's aunt JoAnn, and his nephew who is being deployed to Somalia, and the souls of Deb Cumro and Joe Vinton's brother. Father Lux closed the meeting in prayer.
