Just the other day, the Nebraska Supreme Court ruled to keep LB574 in legal effect while the Court considers the ongoing challenge to its constitutionality. LB574, passed this last legislative session, protects babies from abortion starting at 12 weeks gestational age. This decision by the Nebraska Supreme Court is just one more victory for the pro-life cause in Nebraska, and adds to the many other wins we've seen in the last several years, such as: giving hope to Moms who want to reverse their chemical abortion process; banning dismemberment abortions; preventing taxpayer dollars from going to the abortion industry; and defeating countless attempts to make Nebraska an abortion destination state.








that helps us reach beyond our own limitations with God's help.
