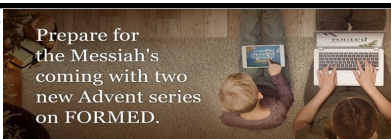


Michael lives at the dump in Mexico City and is served by the ministry of Hope of the Poor. He has a powerful testimony of faith. As he works he prays for others. With no electricity, when the sun goes down he goes to his home that he made from discarded pieces of plywood at the dump. He listens to the audio bible that he charges with a solar battery while he works. Despite a very difficult life of growing up at the dump Michael has led a Christian life and prioritized his relationship with God. Recently he was reunited with his daughter after many years of separation. He found her on social media and they were able to meet. Michael shared the immense blessing it was to see his daughter after 20 years of separation. His smile was contagious. The witness of faith through such suffering impacts everyone who hears his story.

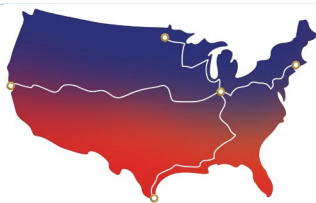
