Last week I wrote about my life with goats, as related to Jesus, the Good Shepherd. As most of us are not familiar with 'shepherding', we are also not aware of managing a vineyard. To the people of Jesus' time, however, these were everyday aspects of their lives, & they clearly understood His deeper meaning as He described the normal routine of caring for sheep & grapevines.

Along with raising goats, our family also grows a vineyard in our front field. We feel very blessed for having, somehow, connected to the life of the Israelites, & Jesus' teachings, in our ordinary lives. In the early springtime, grapevines must be cut back, or pruned, as grapes will only grow on new wood each year. The old and/or dead branches are cut off of the vines, which forces them to produce new branches



# St James Parish Council and Finance Council Joint Meeting Minutes

# April 24, 2024

St James Parish Council and Finance Council held a joint meeting April 24, 2024. Those in attendance were Father Thomas Lux, Ray Vrbka, Karl Gramman, Pat Milke, Brad Wilkens, Rosie VerMaas, Jenny Oelke, Denise Clements, Deanne Stieb and Grace Benes. The meeting as opened with prayer. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Pat Milke gave the building and grounds report. The parking lot lights and sign lights were replaced with LED bulbs. This was a two day project. Price's Tree Service also contacted Pat about replacing the ash trees that were removed in front of the hall. These will be replaced with maples. Two or three pines on the east side of the church will also be replaced. There is a sign up for mowing this spring and summer.

Father Lux received our deposit back from ServePro. They were unable to do the mold inspection. Paul Davis Restoration will come and give an estimate for the mold issues. Another firm would be needed to test the mold to see what kind it is.

Confirmation will be May 7th for 25 students. May 5th is the last CCD class. May 5th will also be Recognition Sunday for our graduating seniors and for our CCD teachers. May 5th will also be May Crowning. Totus Tuus will be in July at St James. Renee Mitchell will coordinate Totus Tuus this year. She would like someone else to take it over next year.

Rosie VerMas gave the PCCW report. The Scholarship Breakfast was April 21st. PCCW served the First Communion Retreat breakfast and lunch. Fern Sullivan made a beautifully decorated cake for the retreat. We will provide cookies and juice for the Confirmation reception.

Brad Wilkens attended to discuss parish expansion. He suggested we get input from all parishioners as to our wants and needs.
