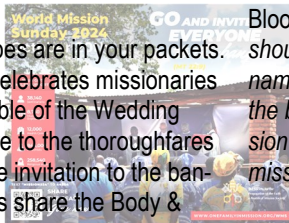

....WHO SINGS, PRAYS TWICE.....

On Sunday, September 29, St James Parish honored Jim Fuhrman for the 50+ years he provided us with music for nearly every liturgy over those years. In celebration of his long dedication, many former choir members, & others, joined him in the choir loft, singing for the 8am Mass. After Mass, he happily thanked all the singers, & said how wonderful it would be if they could join him in the choir loft every Sunday.

St Augustine told us that **“One who sings, prays twice.”** That day, church members experienced those musical prayers, as their comments expressed feelings of joy & gratitude for the beauty that the impromptu choir brought to the Mass.

Years ago, when we first came to St James, there was a small choir, which became a large one, when a director & members of the parish volunteered their time and talents to rehearse and sing for one Mass a week; & of course Jim wonderfully accompanied the group. The parish then had about 70 families. Later other people stepped forward, & committed to singing in a choir. Now, even though St James has more than doubled in size, ever since Covid, we have had no choir to lead us

as we sing from the pews.

Many of us listen to music every day on some form of media, & I would guess that many of us also sing along to our favorite songs. Just think, whatever enjoyment we have in singing could be in a choir, bringing glory & praise to God during Mass. So even in the busyness of our lives, all we have to do on a Sunday, is climb those stairs to the choir loft for whatever Mass we attend, & join Jim in singing the songs he has prepared for all the parishioners. Hey, Mom & Dad, kids.... No rehearsal, no specific commitment, but a small group of people, formerly called a choir, helping Jim to lead everyone downstairs as you sing the songs of God in celebration of the Mass.

If you already know most of the hymns, Great; but if not, they could be listed in the bulletin in advance from week to week so you could prepare on your own, if you wish. As mentioned, the people that sang on the 29th, gathered on the spur of the moment, to honor Jim: no advance preparation, & yet those people in the pews below were “blown away” & lifted up by the voices coming from the choir loft. Join Jim upstairs. Do this for yourselves....do this for them....**do this for God!**
