

....A SURGE OF THE HEART....

Why do we pray? In looking at a recent Church bulletin, we are specifically asked to pray for: Pope Francis' intentions, vocations, Worldwide Marriage Encounter, seminarians, Priests, Respect Life Month, "town-hall" style meetings at St. James, & for 50 States in preparation for Election day. We are encouraged to praise God at Mass, to give thanks (Eucharist means thanksgiving), & to ask forgiveness, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

According to this list, it seems that we pray to get things that we think are good for us: prayers of Petition. Jesus said, Ask, and you shall receive. Knock, and it will be opened unto you. Do we understand all of what Jesus is saying? Is prayer more than St. Augustine's comment, Man is a beggar before God.?

So, what is prayer? From St. Therese of Lisieux: For me, prayer is a surge of the Heart; it is a simple look toward heaven, it is a cry of recognition and love, embracing both trial and joy. If this description is not quite how you think of prayer, "join the group"! As we are wrapped up in our daily lives, we understand the word "trial", easily,

as we ask God for help..... But what about the humble clarity of her belief in the rest of St.Therese's statement?

According to Scripture, it is the heart that prays....The heart is the dwelling place where I am, where I live ... The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason...only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully It is the place of Covenant....There Christ comes to meet every human being...In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with His Son, Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit." (CCC 2563, 2560, 2565)

So, how do we pray? Intensely, for our needs; and fervently, for the gift of our relationship with God, Who lovingly meets us whenever our hearts simply "look toward Heaven". If you still feel, as St. Paul says, "we do not know how to pray as we ought", just believe in the rest of his words, but the Spirit itself intercedes with inexpressible groanings. And the One who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit...(Rom 8:26)
