...A SMALL ROPE WITH SOME BEADS ON IT....

When I was a child in first grade, we moved from our rented house to our 'owned' house in a small neighborhood surrounded by cornfields on the edge of Lincoln. My life began to be regulated by the Church bells from St. Elizabeth Hospital chapel, just a block away: 6am - get up, 12 noon - eat lunch, 6pm - supper & bath. We kids went to public school until our parents were able to get us into Blessed Sacrament Catholic School, which was our first experience with Catholic religious sisters, the Sisters of Mercy. They were like parents to us & we were like their children to them, & I loved it! .

From the "nun"-teachers, I began to hear stories from the Bible, along with studying Church History, &, of course, daily Catechism. I was encouraged to read as much as possible about the Church & from the Catechism, but not to read the Bible, "because", we were told, that "only Father can interpret the Word for you because you might not understand it."

Being naturally curious & a voracious reader, this was something I didn't want to hear from Sister, but being an obedient child, I obeyed her instructions. The only problem I had was that my best friend in the neighborhood, a boy named Jose, attended a Protestant Sunday school where they 'read' the Bible every Sunday; & he took every chance he could to quote it

The Catechism teaches us that even when the choices are imperfect, we still have the **obligation & privilege to vote** (CCC 1913-1915). When <u>life is on the ballot</u>, it's not just a political battle, <u>it's spiritual warfare</u>.

As Nebraskans, we don't stand for extreme proposals like

Saint John Paul II urged us to act in defense of life.

In this year's election, that means voting **AGAINST Initiative 439** the unsafe & unregulated abortion proposal, & supporting incremen-

tal steps like Initiative 434 . which safeguards Nebraska's pro-life protections without creating a right to abortion.

(If you hear pro-lifers are confused about whether they should vote

to me, mostly to impress me with something he knew & I didn't. (He even had his own Bible, but I wasn't allowed to even open our old family Bible!) At those times, my only defense was to wave my Rosary in his face, showing my importance by having a more visual, more beautiful Church symbol than he had, & couldn't have, in his Church.

Looking back to my childhood, I guess my First Communion Rosary was a simple declaration of my Catholicism, & I could have it with me always, including under my pillow at night. And now, when I think about it, the Mysteries of the Rosary were my Bible stories, even when I couldn't read the Bible. Possibly because of that childhood experience, I love reading the Bible & meditating on it's "stories", & I have Rosaries all around the house; but none of them are as special to me as my old, worn, beautiful, First Communion Rosary.

October is the month of Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary. For the inspiring story of the Rosary, go to the website, <u>Dynamiccatholic.com/history/</u> <u>rosary</u>. In that article are words which most express my love of the Rosary in its deepest meaning:
