Info on the Plenary Indulgence for poor souls in purgatory at this time of the year. An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery & pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. Typically the indulgence is plenary each day from 11/1 thru 8; on other days of the year, it is only a partial indulgence.

**Requirements:** To acquire any plenary indulgence it is necessary also to fulfill the following 3 conditions: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, & prayer for the Intention of the Holy Father while being detached from sin. It is appropriate that the sacramental Confession & esp. Holy Communion & the prayer for the Pope's intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites & prayers be carried out within several days (about 20) before or after the indulgenced act. 1 sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion & a separate prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence. The condition of praying for the intention of the Holy Father is fully satisfied by reciting 1 Our Father & 1 Hail Mary. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of the day.
