...RECLINE AT TABLE IN THE KINGDOM OF GOD...

Have you ever thought about how the celebrations & holidays in our lives are centered around meals? Christmas, Easter, Birthdays, Weddings, Funerals. The offering of food to our guests seems to be the ultimate gesture of hospitality, maybe because food is our ultimate need for life, & fulfills our ultimate need for community with others. The special attention we give to provide wonderful, satisfying meals, different from our everyday fare, adds to the happiness we feel in eating & talking together with those we care for.

God uses food, the most human of needs, & the most human of pleasures, to illustrate His longing for us to come to His Banquet in Heaven. He gives us many examples in the Bible of our participation in eating with Him. From the Old Testament: *On this mountain, the Lord of Hosts will provide for all peoples a feast of rich food & choice wines, juicy, rich food & pure choice wines.* (Isaiah 25: 6);... *every family must procure for itself a lamb...they will consume its meat...eating it roasted with unleavened bread & bitter herbs ...* (Exodus 12:3,8). From the New Testament: *...there is a boy here who has five barley loaves & two fish; but what good are these for so many?...Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, & distributed them to those who were reclining...about 5000 in number.* (John 6:9,11); *And people will come from the east & the west & from the north & the*

south & will recline at table in the kingdom of God. (Luke 14:29); *Then he took the bread, said the blessing, broke it, & gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given for you; do this in memory of me...This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which will be shed for you.* (Luke 22: 19-20).

In "memory" of Jesus, & at His word, we offer the Sacrifice of the Mass, receiving His body & blood, soul & divinity in the Holy Eucharist at the "table" of the Lord. In the *Catholic Catechism* (1329), Eucharist is called "The Lord's Supper, because of its connection with the supper which the Lord took with his disciples on the eve of his Passion, & because it anticipates the wedding feast of the Lamb in the heavenly Jerusalem, described in Revelation (19:9): *Then the angel said to me, "Write this." Blessed are those who have been called to the wedding feast of the Lamb....These words are true; they come from God.*"

Recall Jesus' appearance on the road to Emmaus; *And it happened that, while he was with them at table, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it & gave it to them. With that their eyes were opened & they recognized him...*(Luke 24:30-31)

Do we recognize Him each time we receive the Eucharist in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass?
