#### ...ALONE WITH JESUS IN THE DARK...

Several weeks ago, in this column, the question was asked, "Why do we pray?" Now the question is, "How do we pray? From the Catechism: "...each believer responds according to his heart's resolve & the personal expressions of his prayer." The three "Expressions" or kinds of prayer are given as: Vocal, Meditation, & Contemplative. (CCC #2699, 2700 - 2724)

Catholics commonly use Vocal prayer as a group; we pray together, most often using the words which we have learned: Our Father, Hail Mary, recurring prayers of the Holy Mass, etc. In some settings, we also share our spontaneous, individual prayers. Vocal prayers begin in our internal thoughts & we express them externally to God with our voices. These prayers sometimes are private, aloud or silent; but, when spoken in the presence of others, we hear people praying aloud with us, & we become one voice with them, as we lift our hearts to God.

Prayers of **Meditation** are silent, reflective prayers; using thoughts & images, we have an inner dialogue with God about Sacred Scriptures or other spiritual aspects. Meditation is intellectual, emotional & imaginative reflection, which increases our desire "to deepen our convictions of faith, convert our hearts, & strengthen our will to follow Christ". (CCC 2708) Good examples are the Mysteries of the Rosary, or Lectio Divina. However, the simple silence & deep pon-

dering over the 'meaning' of a concept can carry us into the final "Expression" of silent prayer, Contemplative.

Contemplative prayer is resting in the presence of God, beyond talking, thoughts, images; not thinking, wordlessly resting in God's infinite love; opening our soul to His love & offering our love to Him who made us. This prayer "seeks Him 'whom my soul loves'. It is Jesus, & in Him, the Father. We seek him, because to desire him is always the beginning of love, & we seek him in that pure faith which causes us to be born of him & to live in him. In this inner prayer we can still meditate but our attention is fixed on the Lord him*self.* " (CCC #2709)

Recently, a fellow parishioner shared this very personal prayer & contemplative experience.

Wednesday evening I showed up late for daily Mass. I got the time messed up.

I got there just as Mass was ending. So I thought I'd do a Holy Hour. Everyone left. Father saw me sitting there as he was leaving, & he struck up a conversation with me. He offered me the Eucharist. Just he ... & I... & the Eucharist.

Father left....& I sat in silence & darkness with God for awhile....just contemplating His love...I was alone with Jesus in the dark...just He....& I. Just being quiet..
