...THE STREAMING OF A VITAL CURRENT....

Friday, November 22. On that day I was made aware of the power of prayer. Without describing everything in stark detail, it began with a tree-cutting crew we had hired to cut down several huge elm trees growing too close to our house. After smoothly & safely taking down two of the trees, with the crew foreman suspended 70 ft. in the air in a bucket attached to a crane, the hydraulic system burst a hose, & with the rush of fluid, the operator in the truck knew his foreman was in great danger of plunging to the ground. Through his com. system he warned him to be perfectly still, & called the hydraulic company for help. Through a series of commands from the company, he was able to safely lower him to the ground. Later, the operator shared his fear with us that the foreman could have died if he had used his own bucket controls in those first vital moments.

Just a few hours after this, one of the crew was in a truck controlling a large grappling hook, loading branches. Being un-

ware of the power lines lines high above our front field, he moved the boom of the "hook" & hit both of the wires, causing a great surge of electricity to pulse through the entire rig. He saw a flash & felt the machine shake as he managed to pull loose from the wire. Somehow he was not electrocuted. Later, he told us that he thought his life was saved because of the thick, fiber-filled cushion he was sitting on, which instead of 'grounding' him, sent the electrical surge past him, to be stopped by a large pad under his truck tires.

All this happened on Friday, while my sister was in the hospital fighting for her life, suffering from 3 heart stoppages, & Covid that had infected her brain. During the work going on outside the house, we were inside, besieging Heaven with prayers that she would live. We filled the very air surrounding our home with our petitions, asking for mercy, grace & healing from our Lord Jesus & His mother, Mary.

It wasn't until Saturday morning, once our prayers for my sister had been thankfully answered, that we fully realized all the

near death experiences filling the previous day.

My early Friday morning on-line Meditation came back to me with startling clarity. **"Essentially a soldier, the Christian is always on the lookout.**

He has sharper ears and hears an undertone that others miss; his eyes see things in a particularly candid light, and he senses something to which others are insensible, the streaming of a vital current through all things." (Msgr. Romano Guardini)

If, as Christians, we "sense something to which others are insensible", did we experience that "vital current" in the form of **miracles** taking place on Friday? If so, had they been in response to our prayers, filling & inundating our hearts & souls, & used by God's will to heal & save? Did we witness the "power of prayer"? Only God knows!
