....GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD....

God walked with Adam in the garden of Eden, but then man sinned, and that intimate relationship with God was torn apart through man's disobedience. From Eden to Bethlehem, God became distant and mysterious, mainly communicating with His people through the prophets; intervening with frightening power and might at times, but always loving and caring for the "stiff-necked" chosen ones.

The great Prophet, Moses, confronted with God in the burning bush, asked to know His Name, but God responded to him in an utterly mysterious way, "I am who I am"; then, in more comprehensible words, He said, I am "The Lord, the God of your ancestors..." (Ex 3:14-15) Later, after being called by God "an intimate friend", Moses begged, "Please, let me see your glory.", and God answered "... you cannot see My face, for no one can see Me and live!" (Ex 34:18, 20)

This was the almighty and inscrutable God, worshipped and adored through the many ages; and when the prophets testified about a Messiah, an anointed king, who would save them from all their enemies, they were filled with hope, from generation to generation, in the covenant God had made with them.

The Israelites of Jesus' time believed that the Messiah would be a man, a descendent of the house of David, who, as king, would save his people by defeating evil and gathering them together in Jerusalem,

the holy city of God. They waited for a man who would be the Messiah. It was never imagined that the Omnipotent God would lower Himself, and become a man, to save them! Their belief was based on the Psalm verse, "When I see your heavens, the work of your fingers... What is man that you are mindful of him?" (Ps 8:4-8)

The followers of Jesus, had faith in Isaiah 7:14, "...the Lord himself will give you a sign; the young woman, pregnant and about to bear a son, shall name him Emmanuel. (God with us) and, in Isaiah 9:5, "They name Him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace."

As Catholics, we believe in Jesus' words to the Apostles, in John 14:6,9-10:

"I am the Way and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me. If you know Me, then you will also know the Father. From now on, you do know Him and have seen Him....Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father....I am in the Father and the Father is in Me..." (Jn 14:6,9-10)

At Christmas, we feel the Love our Father in Heaven has for us, sending His Son to become one of us, saving us as our Messiah. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."
