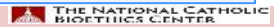

...GOD CAME OUT ON TOP....

On January 20th, the College Football Championship game was played in Atlanta, Georgia. The two contending schools were Ohio State & Notre Dame. Ohio State defeated Notre Dame with a final score of 34-23 to win the National Championship.

If you're not a football fan, why should this matter, especially in a column for the National Eucharistic Revival? "Sponsored by the U.S. Catholic Bishops, the revival aims to inspire people to encounter Jesus in the Eucharist, & to renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ..." (USCCB website)

With this statement in mind, how does the game matter? It matters because of how it relates to the third & final year of the Eucharistic Revival, a year devoted to the mission of the Church. As the campaign organizers say on the revival's website, those who have been "healed, converted, formed, & unified" by the Eucharist have a mission to teach others "for the life of the world."

Football fans, ostensibly, watched an exciting Championship football game; but in essence, we were watching two teams, both of which asked God to be on their side. The Ohio State team knelt on the field before the game, in prayers for their safety & success, while Notre Dame players attended Mass on the morning of the game. Along with some other team members, the two quarterbacks

wore wrist bands with Bible cites, one of which read "Proverbs 27:17", that is: "Iron is sharpened by iron; one person sharpens another." (a reminder of the benefits of struggles.) After the game, in the interviews on the field, both quarterbacks thanked God for what they had been able to do for the team & the school.

To some viewers watching the postgame show, the fact that players were publicly expressing their faith in God may have been surprising, but even more so because they were strikingly unselfconscious. In their emotional response, as winners or losers, they may not have been totally aware that they had been modeling all that Christ had asked them to do, to show people their belief & love for Jesus, the Son of God & in that way to open others up to God's saving grace. This is Mission in action.

Seeing & hearing these athletes' belief & love for God on display, in the playing of a sport, may have surprised many fans, but hearing the quarterback of Notre Dame, Riley Leonard's description of the game, clears up any confusion.

"Us & Ohio State were the two teams who praised Jesus Christ the most & I think we strengthened each other in our faith. God came out on top no matter what the circumstances."
