

#### ....REST IN THE PURE UNCEASING LOVE....

Last night our *Great Pyrenees* dog, *Alana*, barked outside from dusk to midnight. It was a moonless night, so she could not see, but her nose and ears told her there were 'beasts' somewhere on our acreage who could be a danger to her people, and she needed to scare them away before they could do harm. She's a very big dog, and this night, her bark ranged from a deep "woof, woof", to the higher key of a shrill "yipe". Pyrenees are guardian dogs, mostly living outside, who respond to any change from the normal, with a heightened sense of protection for those they love. At 10:30, after we put her in her kennel for the night, her bark was muffled, but it gave me a sense of security and comfort as I lay in bed.

With that chorus of sound in the background, I finished my rosary, the Sorrowful Mysteries, and in that frame of mind, I thought about how the Shakespearean quote, "the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune" was part of our life recently, i.e., two horrendous plane crashes with many lives lost, bombings in Ukraine and the Middle East, a total government 'realignment' in federal politics, and finally, more deeply, many peoples' personal and mental unrest, as the 'unchangeable' of their lives is being threatened and changed.

How do we find a "sense of security and comfort" in this unsettled and unsettling world that we live in? A man was interviewed after the plane crashed into the streets of Philadelphia. He told the reporter that if he lived just a block closer, his home would have been hit by the plane and he would have been killed. Fearfully, he cried, "Nothing like this has ever happened to me! Falling out of the sky! O God, how could this happen here!" Recalling this, in the middle of the night, caused me a restlessness that denied sleep, and brought on the train of thought that we live in a horribly, traumatic world, in which the normal has become the 'unnormal'; and St. Matthew's warning words (Matt. 24:6-13) came to me: "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you

are not alarmed, for these things must happen, but it will not be the end."

Pondering this "warning", I realized that when the man in Philadelphia said, "O God", he was not praying, he was using God's name to express his fear of what had happened. As human creatures, we often ignore God as our Father, at the onset of personal trauma, by thinking, "How could this have happened to me?!". When our orderly world is shocked by change, in our fear for ourselves, how often do we lose sight of the One Who is Order and Security and Comfort and Love? And Everlasting Life!

With these unresolved thoughts in my head, I finally fell asleep. In the morning, as I woke up, I needed some resolution that had evaded me by the lateness of the night. I found it in God's words, speaking to me from the Bible, images that expressed the fatherly comfort and love of God in personal, human terms.

"Jerusalem...I yearn to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her young under her wings...." (Matt 23:37) "The God of old is a refuge; a support are the arms of the Ev-

erlasting." (Deut 33:27)

"I drew them with human cords, with bands of love; I fostered them like those who raise an infant to their cheeks; I bent down to feed them." (Hosea 11:4)

"I thought, How I would like to make you my children!" (Jer 3:19)

"As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you... (ls 66:13)

"He shielded them, cared for them, guarded them as the apple of His eye." (Deut 32:10)

My final thought was that, if my dog in my earthly life brings a feeling of security and comfort, how far beyond my imagining do I 'rest' in the pure, unceasing Love that flows to us from God,.. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?
