



...INTO HIS LIKENESS

Lent 2025- Other than different dates, it feels like 2024, 2023, 2022, ad infinitum. (Latin "to infinity", loosely means "same old, same old"). Let's see... what do we usually do for *Lent*? Get ashes on Ash Wednesday. Fast & abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. Give something up, or do something "holy". No meat on Fridays. Go to Confession. Besides Mass on Sunday, try to go to Church during *Holy Week*, et cetera, & so forth.

Is doing all this the reason for *Lent*? To slow us down for 6 Sundays & 40 week days, & to make us experience a harder life, so we can realize, & be sorry for how far away we have moved from God's rules & commandments?...And is Lent the penance for that?

Sounds about right, doesn't it? BUT...if not that alone, then... What?... Why?

"What" is Lent? "Historically, Lent was the retreat-like final preparation period for catechumens, those being initiated into the Church... Naturally enough, it became in time a renewal period for the already baptized faithful.... It was also a time of penance for those enrolled in the order of penitents, an early form of the Sacrament of Penance limited to serious sinners... The whole Church came to adapt Lent as a penitential season whereby the faithful imitated both catechumens & serious sinners in doing penance." (The Catholic Source Book)

"Why" is Lent? Theologically, Lent is meant to help restore us to our place as children of God. "Disfigured by sin & death, man remains "in the image of God", in the image of the Son, but is deprived "of the glory of God", of His "likeness". (Catholic Catechism #705) Along with true repentance for our sins, the season of *Lent* creates a time of renewal, encouraging us to get to know Jesus better, & to love Him more, not only as our God, but as our Savior, Redeemer, Brother, & Friend; & to listen in our hearts, as He reminds us who He is, as He did the woman at the well, "I am He, the One who is speaking to you." (Jn 4:26) And to Isaiah (42:6) "I am the Lord. I have called you...I have taken you by the hand, & kept you.'

"Lent is not a race to perfection, but a journey of transformation. It's about allowing Jesus to work in you, healing what is broken, & deepening your relationships with God, yourself, & others. Let this season of Lent be one where you open yourself to the grace of God & *His transforming love.*" (Anon)
