



...THE PRESENCE OF OUR GOD ...

In the Sanctuary of a Catholic Church, behind the altar, is a brass stand with a red glass globe holding a burning candle. The flame shining thru the red glass casts a pinpoint glow which reflects on the gold of the Tabernacle nearby. Within the Tabernacle rests a golden ciborium within which lies the consecrated body of our Lord Jesus Christ, in the form of a white unleavened piece of bread. The flame burns for all to see, proclaiming the presence of our God & Savior, whom we worship & adore.

Here & there, in the large room, or 'Nave' of the Church, a few worshippers are kneeling in the pews after Mass, offering prayers of praise & petition, in thanksgiving for the Holy Eucharist, which they had just received during Communion minutes before. Their silent & interior meditation seems to reflect Jesus' request, "Do this in memory of Me.'

Also in the Nave are other 'worshippers', gathered in groups of 2 or more, talking among themselves, voices rising & falling, as they discuss the day ahead, the latest local news, or the funny thing that happened on the way to Church. They are standing or sitting in small groups, some with their backs to the altar, & to the presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle, signified by the constant glow of the red flame. The reverence & sense of awe filling the Nave a few minutes before, during the Mass, has disappeared as they turn their attention to the commonalities of conversation between agreeable acquaintances & friends- fellow Catholic Church-goers. For those few that are praying, the loud, vocal sounds in the Church body have muddled the quiet air of contemplation they need in privately communing with God.

The Catholic Catechism calls the church building, "...a house of Prayer in which the Eucharist is celebrated & reserved, where the faithful assemble, & where is worshipped the presence of the Son of God, our Savior, offered for us on the sacrificial altar for the help & consolation of the faithful..." (CCC #1181)

'Catholics see their churches as sacred spaces for meeting God....the nave & altar work together to focus attention on the Eucharist...the practice (of the red lamp) began in the Middle Ages to protect the Eucharist & to allow private prayer... The tabernacle reminds Catholics of Christ's constant nearness." (catholicshare.com)

Unfortunately in many Churches today, "Catholic Church-goers" are not aware of the purpose of silence & sanctity within the Nave of the Church; but hopefully, once they understand the reason for maintaining holiness in that space, they will choose accordingly, & once Mass is finished, will genuflect to God's Presence, & step through the doors into the 'Narthex' (vestibule/entryway), Here they can speak with each other in wonderful, necessary, & enjoyable conversations, making their choice a reverent practice, one which allows the faithful to love our Lord, & to love our neighbors as well.

O Jesus, we adore thee, Who in thy love divine, Conceal thy mighty God-head in forms of bread and wine. O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment thine.
