I DO BELIEVE, HELP MY UNBELIEF.

We waver between belief & unbelief. When all is right with our life, belief is so easy. When difficulties surround us, unbelief crowds into our soul. Then the questions come: 'Why didn't you answer me? How could you let this happen? If you love me, you would help me.'

This last plea is not a question, but a demand. 'Prove to me that you really love me! I don't want what you want, but what I want!' Which translates into 'I know better what's good for me than you do'. This is unbelief fully taking hold of us. If all of this is addressed to another person in our relationships, we can certainly, in a human way, understand the questions & demands; but consider the implications if you are talking to God! Do these thoughts enter our heads even then?

Look to the Passion of Jesus & His questions & demands of His Father. As God, he knew the physical suffering ahead of Him, & the overwhelming pain of the mental agony He would experience in His acceptance, in the place of all humanity, **'to become sin, even though He was sinless'**. His humanity spoke to His Father: *"Abba, Father, all things are possible to Thee. Remove this cup from Me..."*; *"My Father if this cup cannot pass away unless I drink it...; My God, My God, why hast Thou forsaken me?"* (Matthew 26:39,42,46)

It seems, on appearance, that Jesus had the same inclinations as we do, to question what was happening to Him, & to want to know why, as if the answers made any difference in what He might experience; but He fully knew that as the Son of God, He was born onto this earth to die for all those encumbered with sin in a sinful world, offering Himself as sacrifice to save us for His Father. He also knew what humans might do in similar situations, expecting the great pardon & a change of outcome to our sufferings....because we prayed for it.

Look again to Matthew 26. These quotes, in full this time, exemplify

the fine line between belief & unbelief, trust & uncertainty, faith & doubt; and what our Lord Jesus Christ did in showing us obedience & trust in the loving Father of us all: *"Abba, Father, all things are possible to Thee. Remove this cup from me; yet, not what I will, but what Thou wilt."* *"My Father, if this cup cannot pass away unless I drink it, Thy will be done."* *"My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken Me?"* Jesus, not questioning, but calling out the words prophesying His suffering from Psalm 22 of the Old Testament.

A simple statement from Mark 9:24, shows the contrariness of our desires: **"I do believe, help my unbelief!"** "...the believer is choked by the salt water of doubt constantly washed into his mouth by the ocean of uncertainty....It is the basic pattern of man's destiny, only to be allowed to find the finality of his existence, in this unceasing rivalry between doubt & belief, temptation & certainty." (Pope Benedict XVI)

Mt 24:35). The faith of the Church is founded on Jesus Christ, the one Savior of the world, yesterday and today and forever (cf. Heb 13:8). It gives Christ as reference for an answer to the questions rising up from the human heart in the face of the mystery of life and death.
