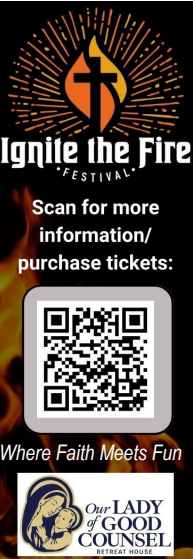

EASTER - THE GOSPEL OF JOHN

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, & saw the stone removed from the tomb. ", so she ran.....

This woman, who once had 7 demons driven from her body by Jesus, was terrified at the sight of the opened tomb, remembering that two days before she had seen the massive stone rolled over the opening, sealing the burial place of the dead body of her Lord....so she ran....

Her greatest fear was that the Roman authorities or the Jewish High Priest had taken His body to hide from His followers; & as she had watched Him die, while standing at the foot of the cross with His Mother Mary, she had no second thoughts that He was alive & had escaped from the tomb after the bloody & agonizing death she had witnessed.

"So she ran & went to Simon Peter & the other disciple whom Jesus loved, & told them, 'They have taken the Lord from the tomb, & we don't know where they put Him.'"

Peter & John, confounded by what she was saying, also ran, John faster than Peter, & entering the tomb, they saw the burial cloths there, which had wrapped the body of Jesus.

The tomb was empty.

For they did not yet understand the scripture that He had to rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned home."

Mary stayed outside the tomb, her fear & sorrow increasing, that Jesus innocent death was made more malicious by this desecration of His body. As she wept, she looked into the tomb, &

saw two 'angels' where the body of Jesus had been. Not aware of the meaning of this sight, she told them why she was weeping.

They have taken my Lord, & I don't know where they have laid Him." When she had said this, she turned around & saw Jesus there, but did not know it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, 'Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?' She thought it was the gardener & said to him, 'Sir, if you carried Him away, tell me where you laid Him, & I will take Him.

Jesus said to her, 'Mary!' She turned & said to Him in Hebrew, 'Rabbouni,' which means 'Teacher'.

In that one word, **"Rabbouni"**, lies all the Praise, Love, & Thanksgiving that Mary & all holy people can utter to our risen Lord & Savior, Jesus Christ.

"Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, Exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, Let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph! Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King. Let all the corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom & darkness. Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lightning of His glory, Let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples." ... (The Exultet)

JUBILEE OF TEENAGERS: April 25-27, 2025 In anticipation of the Jubilee of Teenagers, set within a year-long celebration of hope, we remember the words of St. Pope John Paul II in his message to young people for the 12th World Youth Day.
